The objectives of SHS are: 1. Ensure DFAT has access to high quality health technical inputs that deliver evidence based and timely health policy and program advice through both the core team and additional expertise as required; 2. Demonstrate efficiency and value for money in delivering services; 3. Improve the consistency and standard of DFAT's health policy advice and programming; 4. Support policy coherence and best practice across DFAT's health portfolio; and 5. Ensure that DFAT's health policy. advice programming is informed by highest quality, up to date technical information. SHS commenced operation in June 2015 on a three-year contract with the option of two extensions of two years each. SHS is now firmly established as a reliable and valued provider of health technical assistance to DFAT. The program is in its 5th year of operation and has recently received a second 2 year extension until June 2022. The program has received positive annual feedback from DFAT via the Partner Performance Assessment process. It has also consistently high and improving quality responsiveness feedback from DFAT clients over the duration of its operation. The SHS is run by a small, high performing team that works collegiately with DFAT colleagues to deliver a busy program of work. The team currently consists of five full time staff based in the Canberra office: the SHS Director, Senior Technical Lead, Senior International Health Specialist (vacant), Senior Finance and Administration Manager, Admin and Finance Assistant, and a Reporting and Administration Coordinator. There is one half-time International Health Specialist who works remotely. **Duty Statement:** The Senior International Health Specialist will join the current 3person SHS technical team.
