Position Summary:	Act as Master of the Dambimangari Ranger Patrol Vessel with an emphasis on the upskilling and professional mentoring of DAC Rangers and staff involved with marine activities.	
Duties and	Vessel Operation and Maintenance	
Responsibilities	 Responsible for the operation, maintenance and care of the DAC ranger vessel. Assist with the day to day operations, preparation, administration, scheduling and logistical support for field operations. Perform any necessary maintenance and repairs or arrange where required. Maintain a safe work environment and be prepared to take action to ensure safety of crew and passengers. 	
	Ranger Program Delivery	
	 Work with DAC Rangers and staff in leading expeditions in Dambimangari land and sea country (along the Kimberley coastal areas), including to remote locations, associated with completing the marine and Healthy Country work program and targets. Support the delivery of fee-for-service contracts and projects as directed. Ensure compliance by Rangers with DAC Policy and Procedures at all times, including the promotion of safe working practices and instruction of Rangers in OSH policy and procedures. 	
	Staff Training, Development and Mentoring	
	 Provide training and assist with the development of rangers and relevant DAC staff to be able to safely and effectively operate, maintain and repair vessels <12m. Liaise with the Ranger Coordinator and accredited training facilitators to support, encourage and assist Rangers to complete scheduled training courses and develop their professional and personal skills as required.

	 Accurately record any required information regarding vessel operations or training as required. Develop safety management and reporting systems to support the vessel's certificate of survey and operation. Develop and assist with the implementation of policy and standard operating procedures. Record and report all equipment and personal incidents. Operate within budget requirements and display responsible and effective financial management of any allocated funds.

	 Work effectively in your role to maintain supportive, cooperative and positive relationships with Dambimangari Aboriginal Corporation team and with other external agencies and suppliers. Increase the presence of the Dambimangari Rangers within Dambimangari sea country, including liaison, networking and support with other operators and state agencies, such as Fisheries, DBCA and Maritime Safety.

Demonstrated experience in project administration including the development of standard operating procedures and safety management systems. Proficiency in MS Office computing packages and experience managing emails and an ability to produce written reports where necessary. Possess and maintain a level of physical fitness and willingness to work in remote areas, on weekends and public holidays for extended periods (up to 3-weeks).
