Program Background	Transition to Work (TtW) is a federal employment services delivered by the not-for-profit sector across Australia. It is targeted towards early school leavers and young people experiencing difficulty transitioning from education to employment.

Eligibility	 We work with people aged between 15 and 21, who are: not working and have not completed year 12 or a certificate III or; have not worked for 6 months or; not enrolled in school or haven't attended in the last 12 weeks; or identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander and have completed year 12 or a certificate III.

Purpose	We believe work is more than receiving a paycheque. Work provides people with a sense of purpose and sense of self. We are passionate about supporting young people who have become disengaged from education or the workforce and working with them to reach their full potential.
F ocus	We provide intensive, pre-employment support to improve the work-readiness of young people and help them into the workforce (including apprenticeships and traineeships) or education. We also work with employers to ensure young people meet their needs and are supported to settle into jobs. We use creative and fun activities to engage and build the capacity of our young people
Length	We support young people for up to 52 weeks.
Locations	We deliver TtW in the Illawarra region of NSW from our offices in Corrimal and Shellharbour. Where work travel is required, our people have access to a pool of ACSO fleet vehicles.
