BACKGROUND

The Victorian Aboriginal Child Care Agency (VACCA) is the largest organization of its kind in Australia. VACCA is an Aboriginal community-controlled organization that supports and advocates for the Aboriginal community. Our strength lies with our people. Our team is committed to the organisation's vision and values; advocates for our children and other vulnerable community members; and shows respect for, observance and compliance with Aboriginal cultural protocols, practice and ceremony. Our Aboriginality is what distinguishes us from mainstream services and what enables us to deliver the positive outcomes we achieve for our people.

VACCA employs over 600 staff and delivers more than 70 programs across the state. VACCA's experience and expertise in the delivery of therapeutic interventions are underpinned by culture, connection, and healing. VACCA designs, develops and delivers programs with self-determination and an understanding that the intergenerational trauma experienced by our community requires intergenerational and community healing.

Central to VACCA's work is the importance of connection to family, community and culture as essential to Aboriginal children's safety, stability and ensuring that they have an ongoing sense of belonging. As Victoria's largest Aboriginal child welfare agency, VACCA will play a key role in the process of transitioning the care and case management of Aboriginal children from government and non-Aboriginal organisations to Aboriginal community-controlled organisations following the recent decision of the Victorian Government.

PROGRAM AREA

The Aboriginal Children's Healing Team (ACHT) operates out of the Client Service Practice and development directorate and is under the leadership of VACCA's Principal Practitioner.

ACHT is the central point for the development across VACCA of an integrated culturally appropriate and trauma informed approach to working with Aboriginal children and families which looks at Australian history and how it has impacted on Aboriginal people. Theories of trauma, neurobiology, attachment, resilience building, cultural healing and self-determination combined to assist in understanding and responding to Aboriginal children's trauma.

The ACHT program carries the primary responsibility for leading trauma informed practice across VACCA, embracing culture, lived experience and knowledge which is privileged within the scope of the program.

ACHT provides high quality therapeutic culturally embedded services to Aboriginal children and young people who are clients of VACCA.

POSITION SUMMARY

This position will provide culturally respectful and appropriate assessment, using a Mental Health Social Emotional Well Being framework, secondary consultation, advice and healing for children aged 0-18.

The main responsibility of the role:

- Reflective practice to the teams within VACCA.
- To provide high quality culturally sound SEWB secondary consultation to programs within VACCA, assessments and therapeutic plans for children and young people as required.
- To contribute to work to stabilise children's placements, to develop trauma informed transition plans, behaviour management plans and establish predictable routines for children in care.
- To develop and maintain respectful, collaborative and robust relationships with all professionals in each child's care team.

KEY SELECTION CRITERIA

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Demonstrated understanding of, and commitment to, the values that underpin VACCA' vision and purpose and the capacity to take a leadership role in championing these internally and externally

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- Demonstrated awareness and appreciation of Aboriginal societies and cultures, and commitment to continually build knowledge of such, along with a high level of awareness of the key issues which impact upon Aboriginal communities
- Culturally informed understandings of child development, the impact of trauma and the ability to respond therapeutically to Aboriginal children's pain-based behaviours.
- Demonstrated ability to provide trauma informed culturally safe therapeutic assessment and practice with Aboriginal children and young people, including dyadic therapy and culturally informed psychoeducation and coaching with carers and families.
- Demonstrated commitment to working collaboratively and the capacity to negotiate and liaise with DHS, other agencies and the community.
- Tertiary qualification in a relevant field Psychology/Social Work/Speech Therapist/ Family Therapy/Occupational Therapist
- Demonstrated experience in providing social emotional well-being assessment and goal focused therapeutic work with children aged between 0- 18 years.
- Demonstrated ability to develop or willing to develop skills in primary and secondary consultation
- Demonstrated ability to work collaboratively to achieve strategic objectives and improve mutually agreed client and community outcomes
- Demonstrated ability to confidently expresses consistent and accurate messages when engaged in high level communications advocacy on behalf of clients and on behalf of the organisation

DESIRABLE

- Experience working in Aboriginal led organisations and/or a children's mental health service will be highly regarded.
- Experience in developing and delivering training.

REQUIREMENTS

- You must have and continue to hold a full Victorian Driver's Licence and a current employment working with children check card

POSITION ACCOUNTABILITIES

- Provide secondary consultation, reflective practice, therapeutic assessments, goal directed therapeutic plans, healing work, placement support work with carers, which are culturally appropriate.
- Carry a caseload and work directly with clients, their families, carers and professional care teams
- Provide guidance and input into program design and implementation including promoting Aboriginal self-determination, empowerment and cultural practices through provision of advice to management and the team.
- Undertake professional development by negotiation
- Write cohesive, succinct, timely reports for multiple audiences, which include culturally informed formulations and treatment planning
- Provide training, advice, support and consultation to a range of professionals involved with clients
- Support referrals to other agencies or programs for children and young people as appropriate
- Support multi-disciplinary approaches to service provision and actively develop links and

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networks with professionals, agencies and groups who provide health and related services to clients

- Participate in clinical supervision, ACHT meetings and training
- Develop the capacity of ACHT to provide trauma informed practice leadership that embeds the importance of culture, self-determination and community connection as a means of addressing childhood trauma.
- Work with the Manager ACHT, Clinical Team Leader, Principal Practitioner/ Executive Manager, Case Managers, Team leaders, staff and other relevant people to identify how policy and practice can be improved and implement such changes.
- Assist the Manager ACHT and Clinical Team Leader to identify issues in the service system and assist with devising strategies to address problems or initiate service development.
- Maintain continuous, timely & relevant documentation for all clients, in line with ACHT policies & procedures, assist in the development of quality assurance and quality improvement frameworks for the therapeutic healing care of children placed in VACCA Programs.
- Support the development of student placements within ACHT
