JOB DESCRIPTION

Short Description

Calling all educators! The Tutor Network is a new not-for-profit initiative working to recruit and train high quality tutors, placing them in schools in short term assignments to help students to catch up their learning from Covid-19 disruptions.

Long Description

The Tutor Network is a new not-for-profit initiative to help schools and students catch up their learning from COVID-19 disruptions. The Tutor Network's mission is to offer high quality, school-based tutoring intervention to close the learning gap, especially for students from disadvantaged communities.

We are looking for educators-in-training with a great academic record, experience in teaching and a real commitment to help Victoria's students thrive. Working remotely with students in small groups (on a 3:1 ratio), three times a week over six weeks, tutors will focus on students' social emotional wellbeing, motivation to learn, and catch up their content in literacy or numeracy. Tutors and classroom teachers will work closely on specific student goals, weekly lesson plans, student progress reports; The Tutor Network will also provide initial training and ongoing support.

The Tutor Network is seeking tutors for 6-12 hours per week over a 6 week program from Monday 26 October to Friday 4 December.

Tutors will:

- provide online tutoring for Years 7/8 students in either literacy or numeracy.
- work with small groups of students (3:1) supporting the classroom teacher to help these students catch up their learning.
- receive two days of training on 16 and 17 October 2020 by industry experts that complements your previous studies including modules on tutoring pedagogy (incorporating evidence-based trauma-aware teaching, positive education, and wellbeing practices), literacy and numeracy for this student cohort.
- receive ongoing support and professional development training.
- share your interests and passions with young people and act as a role model and mentor.





 receive The Tutor Network certification of training and hours of tutoring practice for your teaching portfolio upon completion

To be eligible to be a Tutor with The Tutor Network you must:

- be enrolled in a Bachelor (3rd or 4th year) or a Masters degree in Teaching Education; be a qualified teacher or teacher's aide; or be a professional tutor.
- have a valid Working With Children Check.
- complete a Police Check.
- be committed to making a tangible positive impact on students, teachers and schools.
- be able to attend two paid days of training on Friday 16th and Saturday 17th October 2020.

The Tutor Network is a new initiative of Teach for Australia. You will be engaged as a casual employee, at competitive rates, by Teach for Australia for the duration of the tutoring.
