Position Title

High Value Donor and Gifts in Wills Co-ordinator

Position Objective

Responsible for development and delivery of BirdLife Australia's Gifts in Wills program and High Value donor stewarding. The role works closely with the Major Gifts Lead, Single Gifts & Appeals Officer and Regular Giving Co-ordinator on acquisition, conversion and management of high value donors and Gift in Will donors.

Status

This is a fulltime ongoing position offered on a 3-year contract. A continuation to the contract after three years would be offered subject to acceptable performance and available funding.

Remuneration / Job Level

Level 3, Grade based on program complexity and scale, experience and expertise and four weeks annual leave.

Location

The position will be based at BirdLife Australia National Office in Carlton, Melbourne.

Reporting

This position reports to the Individual and Community Giving Team Lead.

Key Relationships

Internal: CEO, Team Managers, Development Team Members, Engagement Manager, Communications Manager, Public Affairs Manager, Finance team, Supporter Services and other staff as required.

External: Existing and new mid to high value donors and major donor prospects, current supporters with intention to leave a bequest, suppliers, service providers, legal and financial professionals and consultants

Duties

High value donor stewarding

- Develop and implement high-value fundraising and stewardship activities to deepen engagement and exceed fundraising income targets.
- Plan and coordinate tailored journeys for high value supporters; with particular focus on gift acknowledgment, impact storytelling, surveys, upgrade opportunities and digital and event engagement and to ensure retention and income growth are maximised.
- Monitor and track donor movement and identify opportunities for value uplift.
- Inspire dedicated and loyal high value supporters to raise funds through workplace giving, peer-to-peer fundraising and events.
- Support the Development Manager, Major Gifts Lead and CEO to strengthen systems and build donor insights to better support donor journeys and experience.
- Maintain and update donor records and work with the Digital Transformation team to ensure the transition of supporter information to a new CRM.

Gifts in Wills coordination and engagement

- Plan, schedule and coordinate Gifts in Wills stewardship communications and events to build engagement with both prospect and confirmed bequest supporters.
- Identify and develop Gift in Wills prospects and implement donor acquisition.
- Manage supporter enquires and promptly follow-up those who have expressed leaving a bequest to BirdLife Australia.
- Manage the onboarding of confirmed git in will donors including welcome communications.
- Build and maintain relationships with confirmed gift in will donors.
- Support the Development Manager, Major Gifts Lead, and finance team in estate administration liaising with lawyers and executors ensuring appropriate documentation, timely correspondence and tracking stages of wills.
- Build donor insights on confirmed and realised gift in will donors to better support their donor
 journeys and inform conversion strategy.
- Maintain and update donor records and work with the Digital Transformation team to ensure the transition of supporter information to a new CRM.
- Other duties as directed by your Manager from time to time.

Selection Criteria

Essential

- Demonstrated experience and knowledge in fundraising, marketing or sales and the theories and practices of fundraising.
- Track record of achievement in donor / bequestor engagement and stewarding.
- Excellent written, oral and interpersonal communication skills, including the ability to champion BirdLife Australia and its mission.
- Ability to build rapport with the diverse range of BirdLife Australia supporters volunteers, members, donors.
- Ability to manage confidential and sensitive information about both the organisation and its supporters.
- Demonstrated ability to interact successfully with senior people in the philanthropic, commercial and public sectors.
- Demonstrated skill working with CRM systems and databases (eg Salesforce, Raisers Edge)etc.
- Strong planning, time management and organising skills.
- Ability to interpret and communicate technical information into plain language.
- Analyse and solve problems with good humour and flexibility.
- A willingness and capacity to work flexible hours as and when required.
- Ability to work well with minimum supervision, prioritise and be delivery focused.

Desirable

- Writing donor centric communications
- An affinity with the aims and philosophy of a member-based, not-for-profit conservation organisation.
- An understanding of the role of philanthropy for a not-for-profit and a desire to work in the sector.
- Experience or knowledge of communication and marketing techniques that support fundraising.
- Proven ability to liaise and negotiate effectively with a range of stakeholders.
- Some knowledge and interest in environmental, ecological or avian issues.
