Assignment objectives To improve the Institute's capacity to produce English research papers, reports, policy briefs, etc. To increase the capacity of SMERU researchers and editors/translators to produce English publications through capacity building. These publications will include topics that focus on inclusiveness such as the inclusion of marginal groups, including women, children, youths, and people with disability. To include all people directly affected by the volunteer assignment in the Partner Organisation and community, using strategies that promote: gender equality; inclusion of youth; inclusion of people with a disability; child protection and safeguarding; inclusion of marginalised groups. Duties and responsibilities of the volunteer Prepare accurate English translations of SMERU research papers, field reports, policy briefs, and other documents according to the Institute's house style.
