Scope of role

This paediatric speech pathology role provides a holistic approach to health for children aged 0-17, their families/carers and the local community to ensure our clients receive the best outcomes possible.

Paediatric Speech Pathologists are exposed to a wide range of services including but not limited;

Paediatric Services

As part of the community health paediatric allied health team the role will involve the provision of services utilising an interdisciplinary model of care as well as the provision of individual speech pathology consultations. The role involves mostly centre-based work, including the assessment, diagnosis, development and management of paediatric clients in partnership with their families, carers and other service providers.

School Readiness

School Readiness funding is an exciting initiative that enables kindergartens to access quality programs and supports to help children get the most out of their early learning. Speech Pathologists in this program will be required to work with kindergarten educators and families to build their capacity to support young children's learning in the areas of communication and wellbeing (social and emotional development) and ensure children are able to access and be included in kindergarten and get the most out of it.

Speech Pathology in Schools

The Speech Pathology in Schools initiative is targeting educators who work with children in the foundation stage of primary school and will seek to increase educator understanding, skills and confidence to support and teach children with speech, language and communication difficulties. This initiative aims to improve the quality of the language learning environment and teaching interactions for students with speech, language and communication difficulties.

Key objectives, duties and responsibilities

Children's Services

1. Assessment, planning, delivery, evaluation and continuous improvement related to the provision of paediatric speech pathology services, including those provided as part Medical Benefits Scheme (MBS) funding.
2. Provide supervision and delegation to Allied Health Assistants involved in the provision of services.
3. Plan and deliver services that balance access and continuity of care with cost effective and sustainable solutions.
4. Provision of quality interventions within an interprofessional collaborative practice model of care.
5. Contribute to team direction in filling capability gaps, identify and participate in quality improvement projects and contribute to program evaluation.
6. Maintain accurate statistical information as required by the organisation and high quality client records.
7. Undertake professional development as identified in the Annual Performance Plan.
8. Supervise students undertaking placements including core paediatric, community and interprofessional placements.

Speech Pathology in Schools

1. Work with school educators and families, using evidence based practice, to build their capacity to support young children's learning in the areas of speech, language and communication
2. Focus on language learning environment and teaching interactions for students with speech, language and communication difficulties.
3. Develop and sustain rich language learning environments that are communication friendly classrooms.
4. Provide quality teaching interactions that promote the acquisition of skill for students with speech, language and communication difficulties.
5. Identify children's needs and provide feedback to schools and carers regarding children's developmental levels.

School Readiness

1. Build the capability of educators and families to support children through coaching, modelling, group training, case consultation support and other discipline specific services
2. Contribute to up-skilling of Occupational Therapists and Psychologists in the core business areas of Speech Pathology.
3. Work collaboratively with kindergartens across Inner Gippsland area to plan for how they will utilise their allied health entitlements.
4. Plan and run sessions at kindergartens to ensure the maximum benefit of their allied health entitlements is achieved.

Job requirements:

Applicants must meet the following job requirements:

Mandatory:

1. Speech Pathology degree
2. Eligible for Speech Pathology Australia membership
3. Current Victorian drivers licence
4. Working with Children check
5. Experience in paediatric Speech Pathology
6. Eligible to be a Medicare Benefit Scheme provider
7. Latrobe Community Health Service complies with infectious disease control and immunisation requirements under legislation. This position is classified as a Health Care Worker B. Evidence of immunisation history must be provided prior to confirmed appointment

Desirable:

1. Previous experience in a community setting

Other requirements:

1. Latrobe Community Health Service is a child-safe organisation. The successful applicant will be required to undergo a satisfactory criminal record check from the Australian Federal Police or country of residence.
2. Prior to appointment, a police record check will be undertaken. This will be updated every three years.
3. Prior to appointment, credentialing documentation must be completed and verified.
4. Prior to appointment, preferred applicants must disclose full details of any pre-existing injuries or disease that might be affected by employment in this position.
5. This Position Description and Letter of Agreement will be reviewed from time to time in keeping with changing requirements.
