PARTNER ORGANISATION OVERVIEW

Kanlong Foundation for Differently-Abled Children, Inc. is a non-government organisation registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) on 6 October 2017. They care for differently-abled children, more often referred to as "children with special needs" or "children with disabilities" such as children with Autism, ADHD, learning disabilities, intellectual disabilities, and speech and language impairments.

They envision co-creating a vibrant, inclusive and enabling "SPACE" for differently-abled children with parents, teachers, facilitators volunteers, partners, and civil society. Kanlong Foundation aims to create spaces built on:

- Sensitivity to the felt and real needs of differently-abled children
- Protection of their basic human rights
- Affirmation of their different abilities, innate gifts and resources
- Cultivation of their creativity and facilitation of their
- Evolving capacities towards a life full of hope and meaning

The foundation's work includes advocacy and awareness, diagnosis and handholding, capacity building, and funding support. Their flagship project is Inakay Center for Child Development that begins with an assessment of a child's psychological, developmental, and learning needs to provide them with appropriate assistance and interventions throughout their lifespan. They offer programs for early intervention and early childhood special education. They also have specialized programs such as referral for assessment to developmental pediatricians, speech therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, and preparatory to inclusive school setting.

System (ALS) to help them achieve the goals identified in their Individualized Education Plans (IEPs) and earn certification. The life skills training is also preparatory stage for their entry into the workplace and life in mainstream society.

Other projects are Kaagapay, a community-based instruction program working with the PWD group and the family of those with disabilities. They also partner with schools to collaborate with in creating a more vibrant, enabling, and inclusive learning environment. Other projects are also in the works to better serve the community.

Assignment overview

Kanlong Foundation caters to children, youth, and adults with special needs by offering programs across the life-span from early childhood to pre-employment. Part of their development is their mental health and well-being; this need is also true for their carers. Kanlong hopes to transcend a spectrum of limitation to unlimited possibilities by providing programs and different kinds of intervention and support for children, youth, and adults with special needs.

With this, a volunteer is requested to assist Kanlong in improving its psychological assessment, wellness, and counseling program and in increasing the capacity of staff in best international practices in psychoeducational assessment, case management, treatment plan, counseling and overall program. This will equip the staff with additional knowledge and skills necessary to do and give their best work for the children, youth, and adults with special needs. The role will entail assessment, resource writing, and capacity building. You will be helping Kanlong Foundation build a better and brighter future for the special needs community here in the Philippines.

To assist in developing a psychological program for the children and their families as well as manuals and procedures in psychoeducational assessment, case management, treatment plan and counseling children and families.
