Responsibilities & duties

• Responsibility 1 – Clinical Services

Duties:

- Maintain a commitment to child safety and wellbeing, including adhering to the ACT Group's Code of Conduct and Child Safety standards in all areas of work with the ACT Group.
- Coordinating centralised intake/triage via telephone, and online, and liaising with all referral stakeholders.
- Support the allocation of referrals as per ACTG program guidelines
- Provide counselling support to ACTG waitlist/other clients
- Accurate data entry for all intake systems at ACTG and service delivery time
- Provide therapeutic support services to children, young people, families and adults
- Feedback sessions with parents/carers/case workers/guardians, school staff, etc.
- Keep appropriate client notes in a professional manner and at the standard of the appropriate professional association
- Keep up to date with legal requirements for professional registration
- Maintain highest levels of confidentiality in all matters
- Report writing, documentation and billing related to clinical services or assessment
- Maintain strict adherence to Practice Framework and Clinical Guidelines

Responsibility 2 – Projects

Duties:

• Oversee and/or participate in specific clinical projects as required

Responsibility 3 – Other

Duties:

- Administration documentation and time management.
- Other tasks and projects as required, as skills/ experience develop, which may include developing and conducting training.
- Attend and carry out individual and group clinical supervision

In compliance with our standards for Child Safety you are also required to:

- Provide a welcoming and safe environment for children and young people.
- Promote the safety and wellbeing of children and young people to whom we provide services.
- Ensure that your interactions with children and young people are positive and safe.
- Provide adequate care and supervision of children and young people in your charge.
- Act as a positive role model for children and young people.
- Report any suspicions, concerns, allegations or disclosures of alleged abuse to management.
- Maintain valid 'working with children' documentation.
- Undergo periodic 'national criminal history record' checks.
- Report to management any criminal charges or convictions you receive prior to and during the course of your employment/volunteering that may indicate a possible risk to children and young people.



Academic qualifications & requirements

Essential

- Relevant tertiary qualifications in Mental Health Nursing, Occupational Therapy, Social Work or Psychology and the relevant registration.
- High levels of emotional intelligence and the ability to engage and work independently, as part of a multidisciplinary team and with other stakeholders
- Ability to embrace new programs and be flexible and adaptive
- Hold a valid Working with Children Check at all times and undergo Criminal Records Checks as required.
- NDIS Worker Screening Check

Desirable

- Current Driver's Licence.
- Travel and conduct outreach work in schools, family homes and other community settings, as required.
- Ability to work outside of normal business hours, including interstate travel.
- Medicare provider number.

Work experience & skills

Essential

- Experience working with people who have experienced trauma, disability and or mental illness, (minimum 2 years) across a broad range of acuity, including delivering brief psychological support /interventions if necessary.
- Experience in an intake role that incorporated client liaison, education, advocacy, assessment and support or similar.
- Systemic interventions
- Critical thinking and analytical skills
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- Proactive problem-solving skills.
- Excellent computer skills including all Microsoft office applications.

Desirable

- Training, group facilitation experience
- Understanding of trauma informed practice and the effects of complex trauma
- Formal report writing skills

- You will possess a willingness and capacity to embrace the Mission and Values of the Australian Childhood Trauma Group
- Committed to and acts for the wellbeing of all service users, throughout their ACTG journey
- Self-motivated, ability to work autonomously when required and work well within a team setting

- Excellent interpersonal skills, can build positive, professional relationships internally and externally, working with children, young people, families, governing bodies and other community organisations
