PARTNER ORGANISATION OVERVIEW

The department has 21 full -time officials specialised in 14 different responsible areas. It enforces the law and implements educational policies and resolutions approved by the Ministry of Education and Science. The department is responsible for management of 29 secondary schools , 41 kindergardens and 29 culture centers. The officials at the department are responsible to provide training opportunities to improve local teachers' teaching methodologies & skills and develop professional development resources. Uliastai soum, the center of the Zavkhan province, has 5 secondary schools, 9 kindergardens, the Polythechnic college, the Musical college and Zavkhan School of National University of Mongolia located.

Assignment overview
There are about 70 English language teachers in Zavkhan province. 45 of them work at the secondary school. The farthest school is 450km from Uliastai center so teachers don't always have opportunities to attend the training due to the isolated location and lack of funding. The training shall improve teachers' professional skills, teaching methods and technological skills. The English language teacher who remotely works from Australia will provide regular English language classes to the remote local teachers to improve their language skills. There will be 24 local teachers who live in the rural villages attend this training.
