Key Collaborations

The PYL Alliance Networker works closely with the PYL Steering Group and report to the PYL Management Committee. The role supports wider PYL member groups in delivering key strategies and activities and drive PYL's engagement with a wide range of influential stakeholders from the business and investment sector, indigenous representative organisations, civil society, unions, and others.

Key responsibilities

- Lead the development and implementation of an engagement strategy to build momentum for positive and far-reaching environment law reform amongst a wide range of influential stakeholders particularly business.
- Build and maintain genuine relationships and partnerships with a wide range of influential stakeholders.
- Manage engagement between PYL and third-party organisations including business civil society, indigenous representative organisations, and unions.
- Provide strategic and tactical advice to the PYL Alliance Steering Group and Management Committee.
- Support PYL Alliance strategy development, including preparing policy analysis and facilitating strategy discussions.
- Provide strategic direction to PYL Alliance member groups and support them to deliver key strategies and actions.
- Support the PYL Alliance to produce high-quality submissions, briefs, and letters.
- Observe the safe working practices and as far as you are able, protect your own and others' health and safety

Key selection criteria
