PARTNER ORGANISATION OVERVIEW

SNYC is Samoa's focal point for youth advocacy and youth development issues. It is an Independent organization and relies on donor funding for survival and to be operational. It was initially developed under Ministry of Women, Community & Social Development before being made an Independent organization in 2012. SNYC is made up of representatives from each of the villages in Samoa - altogether, there are close to 200 members as of 2019. 2020 was a very challenging year as a result of covid and the ceasation of some of the core fundings of the Organization like Pacific Leadership Program Australia who was one of the core funding for the organization. Despite the limited funding, SNYC has been surviving through collaborations with other Partner organizations both in Government and Civil Society. The Organization is governed by its Board which is made up of 11 Members and it used to have a Secretariat office with at least 3 full time staff. Currently, there are no staff but is looked after by the Chair, 2 Board members and 3 other Organization Members. The Treasurer and Chair are leading the organization in the mean time and are driving the volunteer program as well as the intern program for the Organization to assist with its administration in the mean time.

ASSIGNMENT DETAILS

Assignment overview

At this stage, we are in dire need of a technical assistance to focus specifically on not only identifying potential grants opportunities for the Organization but most importantly is to be responsible with the actual implementation and at the same time help build our local staff with the capacity building experience in writing of these proposals to ensure SNYC is exploring all the opportunities there are. This role and its scope and fees involved locally would be impossible for SNYC to afford given the fees involved and expertise hence the reliance on this great Australian Volunteer Program. The plan by the Board is, once this takes place, the current volunteers will be trained by the AV to enhance their capacity to be doing this kind of work on top of the implementation work they will be doing in terms of projects etc, which are anticipated to come out of the core work by the Volunteer.

To support SNYC in writing funding proposals in collaboration with the Board and Staff with the intention of sharing the skills and improving the fund proposal writing capacity of our SNYC team.
To provide capacity building trainings for team specifically on AV role to share the knowledge and skills
To include all people directly affected by the volunteer assignment in the Partner Organisation and community, using strategies that promote: gender equality; inclusion of youth; inclusion of people with a disability; child protection and safeguarding; inclusion of marginalised groups.
