#### SPECIALIST CLINICAL SUPPORT - PAT/ACDC

To be responsive to the needs of clients who are likely to die within 7 days of admission and clients who live in Residential Aged Care Facilities (RACF) and Disability Homes.

This role provides a region wide response especially to clients with urgent complex specialist palliative care needs and their families. The focus of the role is on providing prompt and effective psychosocial support and spiritual care where the client lives in RACF or disability home and to those clients accepted for priority assessment. The role works with Intake, the Nurse Practitioners, and the Aged Care Disability Care (ACDC) Nurses to triage referrals, undertake assessments, attend joint visits with nurses, and maintains a caseload of clients particularly those predicted to die within 1-2 weeks or those in aged care facilities likely to die within 30 days.

This role is also a source of clinical advice, education, and support to others internally and externally.

The role is worked as a nine day fortnight, however, occasional on-call may be required.



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#### **Essential Education Qualifications/Competencies:**

- Tertiary Qualification within the field of Social Work, Psychology or Pastoral Care/Theology with two completed units of Clinical Pastoral Education
- Eligibility for membership of, or registration by, relevant professional bodies (see appendix)
- Experience in and strong clinical knowledge of aged care, palliative care and/or community health setting
- Ability to respond with urgency for those identified clients referred to EPC
- High level triage and assessment skills in complex and crisis situations
- Knowledge of current loss, grief and bereavement theory and practice
- Well-developed interpersonal, oral and written communication skills and presentation skills
- Experience with common computer applications
- Previous experience working with issues associated with death and dying
