PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Head to Health - Information Assessment and Referral Service (HTH IARS) program is available across 8 NSW regions for people of all ages, whether their mental health issues are pre-existing or have emerged during the pandemic.

The HTH IARS provides a central intake service that will endeavour to find the best support for consumers. This may be via referral to an existing service or a local Head to Heath hub.

This is a phone/video-based service taking direct incoming referral calls through an established 1800 mental health intake number.

Utilising the Initial Assessment and Referral Decision Support Tool (IAR-DST) to support a nationally consistent evidence-informed initial assessment and referral process, the team will be made up of clinical and non-clinical staff who receive calls and support people to reach the appropriate service.

The HTH IARS is a Neami service located across various locations across Queensland and New South Wales.

The Mental Health Clinical Support Coordinator forms part of a multidisciplinary mental health team delivering high quality mental health intake, assessment, and referral services for individuals across regions who experience mental health issues and are seeking support.

POSITION OVERVIEW

As a Mental Health Clinical Coordinator, you will have a background in Occupational Therapy, Social Work, Nursing or Psychology. As part of the clinical team, you will be part of a multidisciplinary group who provide clinical mental health assessments and facilitate access and connection to appropriate clinical and community services with a focus on facilitating connections to Head to Health Hubs linked to the program.



THE POSITION

Key position Responsibilities, Duties and Accountabilities

- Undertake triage and assessment of mental health referrals
- Assess and screen referrals using appropriate tools, policies, and procedures
- Maintain accurate individual consumer files and databases in accordance with the policies and procedures of Neami and the service agreement with the funding body.
- Provide information about mental health and available services in the community
- Support the continuity and consumer care and information flow between consumers, staff GPs and external workers and other agencies
- Provide individual clinical interventions as appropriate/required
- Participate in additional clinical responsibilities as determined by need and in consultation with the Mental Health Clinical lead
- Provide leadership, secondary consultation, case review and support to other staff including intake workers and other clinicians
- Provide leadership in individual and group supervision, and attendance at team meetings and external meetings
- Foster and maintain relationships with external stakeholders to ensure good communication flow and clear referral pathways
- Participate in community engagement activities as directed and promote the mental health and wellbeing of the community
- Engage consumers and develop trusting and professional relationships
- Commitment to understand consumer data requirements and the role of data, monitoring, evaluation and research activity in organisational culture, operations, and strategy.
- Commitment to support activities related to planning, collection, analysis, reporting and use of consumer data.
- Use of data, monitoring, evaluation, and research to continuously improve service provision, organisational functioning, and the strategic directions.

THE PERSON

Experience, Knowledge, Qualifications, Skills and Attributes

Essential

- The Clinical Support Coordinator will be either a Registered Psychologist, Occupational Therapist
 or Registered Nurse with a current annual practicing certificate from the Australian Health
 Practitioner Regulation Agency essential, or a Social Worker with Australian Association of Social
 Worker (AASW) membership, or is evidence that they are eligible to have membership with the
 AASW.
- Demonstrated experience in the provision of mental health assessment
- Experience working with client information systems, maintaining accurate documentation and data collection
- A valid Blue Card (Social Workers/Non-AHPRA registered clinicians)
- Satisfactory Criminal Record Check
 Criminal record checks are mandatory for all new appointments. Neami will cover the cost of an Australian check. Where a new employee has lived outside of Australia for 12 months or more within the last 10 years, the cost of an International check will be borne by the applicant.
- A valid Australian Driver's License
- You must maintain a right to work in Australia, in the position and location of employment during your employment with Neami. You must comply with all terms of any such grant of a right to work in Australia.
