The SDA Workers Compensation Lawyer works within the industrial team and reports directly to the Principal Solicitor to achieve the Objects of the SDA Rules.

Duties and Responsibilities include:

- Advising and representing members and the Union in relation to workers' compensation matters:
- Providing advice and support to members & the Union in relation to other related industrial matters including WHS, interpretation of Industrial Agreements and Awards;
- Developing and assisting in the Union's strategic campaigns
- Drafting, lodging and running disputes in the South Australian Employment Tribunal and the Fair Work Commission;
- Maintaining files and other documentation in a professional and timely manner;
- Research and providing in house training to other lay member of the SDA about workers' compensation entitlements and related industrial matters;
- Other duties as directed to advance the Objects of the Union.

Experience, Skills and Qualifications

- Demonstrated commitment to the principles of trade unionism is required;
- Sound knowledge of industrial relations, WHS, workers' compensation and employment law;
- High-level interpersonal and excellent written and oral communication skills;
- Well-developed research, analytical, and problem-solving skills;
- Time management & organisational skills with the ability to multi-task;
- Advocacy experience in negotiations and tribunals is preferred;
- Ability to work as a member of a team, including flexibility to take on other duties and responsibilities;
- Computer skills relevant to the position are required;
- Current SA driver's licence desirable;
- Capacity to gain and hold ROE essential.
- Admitted as a practitioner in the Supreme Court of South Australia, or immediately eligible for Admission, and eligible to obtain a practising certificate in South Australia.
