About us

Act for Kids is a prominent provider of prevention, professional therapy and support services for children who have suffered abuse and support for families at risk. With over 30 centres nationally, we have supported thousands of children and their families for more than 30 years. In 2024-2025 we provided services to 37,171 people, including over 21,780 children.

Our unique multidisciplinary teams provide integrated therapy, sexual abuse counselling, safe houses in remote Indigenous communities, information, advice and referral services, intensive family support and preschools designed for children with additional development needs to ensure we set them up for success at school.

About the program

The Individual Support Services (ISS) program works in partnership with Child Safety and other government and non government agencies to provide holistic trauma-informed support to children in the child protection system. The ISS team works in close collaboration to deliver bespoke support packages informed by each child's needs and focuses on increasing the capacity of their support network to meet these.

This ecological model provides specialist attachment-based coaching and mentoring to carers and stakeholders, therapeutic care coordination, practical in-home therapeutic support, specialised therapy and psycho-education based on a thorough assessment of the child and their support network. The program supports children who have experienced significant levels of toxic stress, trauma and adverse childhood experiences resulting in highly complex behaviour and attachment patterns indicative of intense cumulative harm.

About the position

The position is responsible for delivering an outreach model of therapeutic case coordination to families, caregivers, kids and young people within the Individual Support Services (ISS) program.

Key responsibilities

- Use a trauma-informed model to support children and their ecological networks to achieve better outcomes by:
 - Supporting thorough psycho-social assessments.
 - Implementing tailored evidence-informed interventions directly to children to cater to individual need.
 - Supporting reunification plans based on evidence-informed models.
 - Providing psycho-education to carers and stakeholders.
 - Providing practical assistance to the child, family and carers.
 - Coordination of services and support networks using an ecological framework.
 - Facilitating social learning, community connectedness, good health and wellbeing.
 - Supporting case plan goals as determined by Child Safety and the ISS Therapeutic Intervention Plan.
 - Proactively participate in activities including meetings with carers/families and key stakeholders including Child Safety and Department of Education.
- Participate in joint training and professional development opportunities including supervision.
- Professionally and ethically represent Act for Kids in the delivery of the ISS services.
- Build and maintain partnerships with all ISS and partner agencies for the benefit of the service, children and the families.
- Maintain linkages with Act for Kids team members and services through regular attendance at team meetings, organisational events and professional development activities.
- Maintain up-to-date output and outcomes data for all clients as required by Act for Kids policies and procedures.
- Participate in Act for Kids performance development processes through monthly and annual meetings with your line manager.
- Comply with all Act for Kids policies and procedures.
- Maintain confidentiality and privacy in all matters relating to team members, clients, and procedures.
- Fulfil other tasks that your manager/s may reasonably ask you to perform.
- Act as a client/customer focused, values-based team member and work collaboratively with other team members to achieve strong results across all activities at Act for Kids.
- Ensure behaviour during all work interactions is aligned to our values of being *professional, ethical, team oriented, caring, courageous* and *collaborative*.

About you

Qualifications

- Tertiary degree in a relevant discipline (social work, human services, allied health, psychologist).
- Professional registration (if required).
- Membership of a relevant professional association (desirable).

Skills and experience

- At least three (3) years' experience working with children, young people and their families who have been impacted by trauma or have experienced abuse and neglect, or more than five (5) years' experience working in similar roles.
- Demonstrated specialist skills in at least one of the following areas trauma, attachment, social-emotional development, drug and alcohol, mental health, family and domestic violence, child development and disabilities.
- Knowledge and understanding of:
 - Impact of trauma on child development and family functioning.
 - Child development and assessing functioning and wellbeing of children and young people who have experienced trauma and cumulative harm.
 - Family functioning, parenting and attachment, including assessing family relationships and parenting capacity and functioning.
 - Supporting foster and kinship carers.
 - Queensland child protection legislation and policy reforms.

- Experience in developing strategic stakeholder relationships for the benefit of children, young people and families. Extensive local networks and knowledge are highly desirable.
- High level of cultural awareness and experience working with families from different cultural backgrounds, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.
- Willingness to receive cultural supervision in your work with Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.
- Ability to work as part of a multi-agency and multi-disciplinary team and to cultivate a collaborative strengths-based approach to working with families.
- Well-developed communication, problem solving and interpersonal skills.
- Effective time management and case load management skills.
- Ability to use electronic case management and reporting tools and experience using Word and Excel.

Other requirements

- Eligibility for a positive Working with Children Check in the applicable state of employment in Australia or exemption based on professional qualifications and registration.
- Current driver's licence.
- Applicants must be eligible to legally work in Australia and proof of eligibility will be requested.
