About the position

This position is with our Integrated Therapy Service (Psychology, Speech Pathology, and Occupational Therapy) in Adelaide. As the Occupational Therapist on this team, you will be responsible for delivering evidence-informed intervention, standardised and informal assessments and parent training, to support families and children with delays or difficulties in self-care, motor skills, play skills and/or emotional and sensory regulation. Equipment prescription and resource recommendations may also be part of your role.

This job is about:

- Providing an outstanding therapeutic service to children, young people and their families.
- Encouraging and strengthening supportive relationships with adult caregivers.
- Enhancing therapeutic and psychosocial outcomes for children and young people impacted by trauma.
- Working with Act for Kids team members, other professionals and agencies to enhance client outcomes.

Key responsibilities

- Identify and work toward client goals and achieve successful case outcomes for children who have experienced complex trauma.
- Complete discipline specific assessments to contribute to therapeutic plans, in collaboration with the integrated therapy team.
- Meeting program output requirements by maintaining a full schedule of client consultations.
- Provide therapeutic support to children and their families using evidence-informed therapies focussed on attachment, emotional and sensory regulation and socio-emotional wellbeing.
- Assess for and organise the prescription of assistive technology and equipment as required, to enable children to participate across all environments.
- Assure Ensure therapeutic strategies are being supported across all environments by developing in home activities and recommending follow up programs.
- Attend stakeholder meetings to ensure strong collaboration occurs for the benefit of clients and share insights about support needs required across their daily environments.
- Regularly attend and participate in therapy reviews and other case discussions as required.
- Maintain up-to-date case notes, therapeutic plan reviews, assessments, administration requirements and outcomes data for all clients, as required by Act for Kids policies and procedures.
- Provide Case Studies for funders and external stakeholders as required.
- Build and maintain partnerships with local community and government agencies.
- Maintain and develop your professional skills, through supervision and professional development.
- Actively work to promote, build and develop occupational therapy services within the Integrated Therapy Service team.
- Participate in Act for Kids Performance Development processes through monthly and annual meetings with the Clinical Service Manager.
- Comply with all Act for Kids policies and procedures.
- Maintain confidentiality and privacy in all matters relating to team members, clients, and procedures.
- Fulfil other tasks that your manager/s may reasonably ask you to perform.
- Act as a client/customer focused, values-based team member and work collaboratively with other staff to achieve strong results across all activities at Act for Kids.

About you

Qualifications

- Tertiary qualification in Occupational Therapy.
- National registration as an Occupational Therapist with AHPRA is essential.
- Membership of Occupational Therapy Australia is desirable.

Skills and experience

- At least two (2) years' experience working with children, young people and their families who have been impacted by trauma or experienced abuse and neglect, or at least two (2) years' experience working in similar roles.
- Experience providing individual and group therapy to children, young people and their families.
- Clinical and therapeutic understanding of the impacts of trauma on child and family functioning.
- Knowledge of current trauma treatment trends and child protection legislation and policy reforms.
- High level of cultural awareness and experience working with families from different backgrounds, particularly Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.
- Willingness to receive cultural supervision in your work with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and families.
- Willingness to work as part of a team and to cultivate a strengths-based approach.
- Well-developed communication, problem solving and interpersonal skills.
- High level time management and case load management skills.

- Ability to use electronic case management and reporting tools and experience using Word and Excel.

Other requirements

- Eligibility for a positive Working with Children Check in the applicable state of employment in Australia or exemption based on professional qualifications and registration.
- Eligibility for a NDIS Worker Clearance Check.
- Current driver's licence.
- Applicants must be eligible to legally work in Australia and proof of eligibility will be requested.
