Founded in 1851, OzChild supports vulnerable children and young people by providing healing, preventing abuse and neglect, and strengthening families. We work in partnership with children, families, communities and government to reduce harm and create sustainable change.

Our goal is for all children and young people to be safe, respected, nurtured, and supported to reach their full potential.

Child Safety

OzChild is committed to protecting children and young people from all forms of abuse, bullying, exploitation and neglect. We create environments across all programs and services where children are safe and feel safe.

All OzChild People are required to:

- Prioritise the safety and wellbeing of children and young people
- Comply with mandatory reporting and reportable conduct obligations
- Adhere to OzChild's Safeguarding Children Policy and Code of Conduct at all times

Role and Purpose

The **Restoring Families Multisystemic Therapy-Child Abuse and Neglect (MST-CAN®) Psychiatrist** supports the MST-CAN® team at least 4 hours per week by providing quality psychiatric services in the home, the community, and/or by tele-psychiatry. The MST-CAN® Psychiatrist provides input into thorough assessment, case planning and provision of evidence-based treatment in coordination with other clinical stakeholders where children are at imminent risk of removal. As specified by the requirements set out in the MST License this support

will be provided under the supervision of the MST-CAN® Supervisor and MST-CAN® Consultant. MST-CAN forms part of the Restoring Families intervention stream.

MST-CAN® is an internationally recognized program for families who have come to the recent attention of child protection services due to physical abuse and/or neglect.

MST-CAN® is designed to treat 0-17 year-olds and their families and is proven to keep them together, ensure children and young people are safe, prevent abuse and neglect, reduce mental health difficulties experienced by adults and children and increase natural social supports.

Major objectives:

- To reduce the numbers of children and young people aged 0-17 years old in statutory out of home care
- To deliver MST-CAN® interventions to families for up to 9 months.
- To ensure that program fidelity is maintained at all times
- To promote and sustain key relationships with community partners.

The OzChild Way

In undertaking this role, the Restoring Families MST-CAN® **Psychiatrist** supports and demonstrates the OzChild Way behaviours and accountabilities as follows:

We deliver evidence-based services: Deliver strengths based, -evidence informed- practice that is guided by OzChild's National Practice Framework, legislative requirements, and relevant practice models. Apply structured assessment, planning, and intervention approaches to support child safety, address risk, and strengthen family functioning.

Our customers determine our success: Work in partnership with children, young people, and families to ensure services are responsive, respectful, and tailored to their needs, strengths, and circumstances. Support family voice, choice, and participation in goal setting and -decision making, while maintaining- a clear focus on child safety and wellbeing.

We deliver innovative solutions: Use flexible, creative, and responsive approaches to engage families experiencing complexity and multiple stressors. Identify and respond to barriers to engagement and progress, drawing on professional judgement and collaboration to support sustainable change.

We set each other up for success: Work collaboratively with colleagues, Team Leaders, Community Connectors, and partner services to support coordinated, whole of- -family responses. Participate actively in supervision, reflective practice, and shared learning to enhance practice quality, consistency, and outcomes.

I learn, adapt, grow, and embrace my cultural competence: Demonstrate commitment to ongoing learning, reflective practice, and professional development. Practice with cultural humility and responsiveness, recognising and respecting the diverse identities, experiences, and strengths of families, and supporting culturally safe engagement, particularly with Aboriginal children and families.

Position Specific Responsibilities

In order to achieve the expectations as outlined above, the following key areas of responsibility have been identified:

- Provides psychiatric evaluations of child and adult family members, as indicated.
- Has on-going interface with the MST-CAN treatment team concerning psychiatric and medical diagnoses that pertain to child and adult family members.
- Acts as a community liaison with outside physicians/psychiatrists concerning medical or psychiatric care of child and adult family members.
- Provides the team with emergency psychiatric evaluations of child and adult family members as needed in the office, the community, and/or by tele-psychiatry.
- Has a close on-going collaboration with inpatient physicians and clinical team when MST-CAN child or adult family members are admitted to a psychiatric hospital. Works to develop and maintain a collaborative relationship with the physicians and staff of local psychiatric inpatient unit(s) and other residential treatment facilities as needed.
- Coordinates all psychopharmacological interventions with family members.
- Keeps thorough notes of MST-CAN Psychiatric Consultation so these can be included in the client's chart.
- Works with the MST-CAN supervisor to modify and implement safety protocols and documentation.
- Attends MST-CAN group supervision weekly and/or as required.
- Works with the MST-CAN Supervisor to develop and implement evidence-based psychiatric and psychopharmacologic treatment protocols.
- Work in partnership with Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisations and Aboriginal services to support culturally safe practice and better outcomes.
