- strengthen their sexual health knowledge and decision-making skills
- manage risk and make informed choices
- form positive attitudes about sexuality
- celebrate the diversity within their communities and schools

Position title: School Educator (Sexuality and Relationships Education)

Employment: Casual

The job:

- deliver engaging, age-appropriate programs using SEA's provided lesson plans and frameworks
- travel to schools across Melbourne (and occasionally beyond) or deliver sessions online
- work as part of a collaborative and supportive team of educators

Employment conditions:

- a three-month probationary period including an introductory meeting, observation of SEA sessions, and a mentored delivery with feedback and ongoing support
- this is a casual position and work can be sporadic
- work is scheduled during Victorian school terms
- most work is in Melbourne; occasional sessions may be online or outside the metropolitan area
- SEA reserves the right not to offer ongoing work at the end of the probationary period if teaching standards are not met
- all SEA staff are expected to adhere to the Victorian Child Safe Standards at all times
- applicants must hold Australian citizenship, permanent residency, or a valid visa to work in Australia

- Must have:**
- current Working with Children Check
 - current driver's licence and access to a personal vehicle for transport

Key selection criteria: In addition to the above requirements, applicants must meet the following selection criteria:

- available for a minimum of 3 days per week during school terms
- passionate about working with children and young people in an engaging, authentic, and respectful way
- able to connect with and show sensitivity towards students from a wide range of backgrounds
- strong facilitation or teaching skills and the ability to connect with students of different ages
- excellent communication, interpersonal, and organisational skills
- a commitment to ongoing professional growth and staying current in sexuality and relationships education
- ability and willingness to teach across both primary and secondary levels would be an advantage
