Carpentaria clinicians provide culturally safe and appropriate services for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and their families.

Carpentaria staff undertake cultural awareness training prior to working in remote communities. Our Remote Therapy Services team have extensive experience working in remote and very remote contexts and understand the importance of delivering services in a safe and appropriate way. Resources are tailored to meet individual needs and utilise visual language to enhance understanding.

Carpentaria is committed to delivering high-quality services that create meaningful change in remote communities across the Top End and Central Australia.



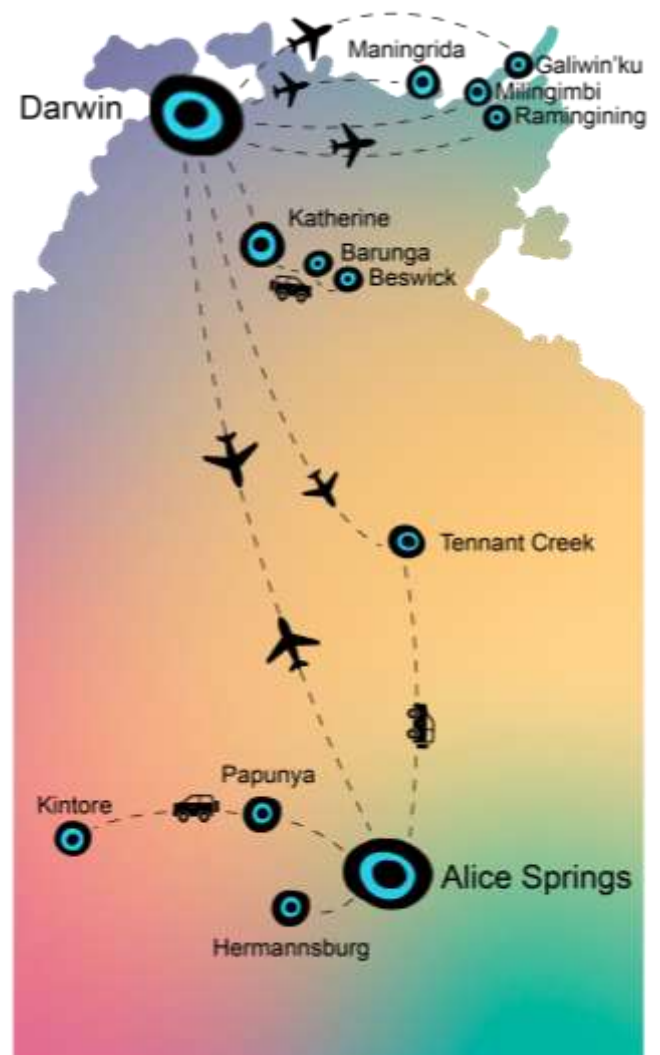
Where we work

Carpentaria's Remote Therapy Services team are based in Darwin or Alice Springs and regularly travel to remote communities across the Northern Territory via light aircraft or 4WD.

Our clinicians are passionate about filling the gaps and providing consistent services to remote communities, including Maningrida, Milingimbi, Ramingining, Galiwin'ku, Katherine, Barunga, Beswick, Tennant Creek, Kintore, Papunya, and Hermannsburg.

Remote trips vary between 2 days (1 night) to 4 days (3 nights). Depending on the needs of each community, trips are scheduled every 2-6 weeks.

When you join the team, we'll find the right balance between urban and remote caseloads to suit you.

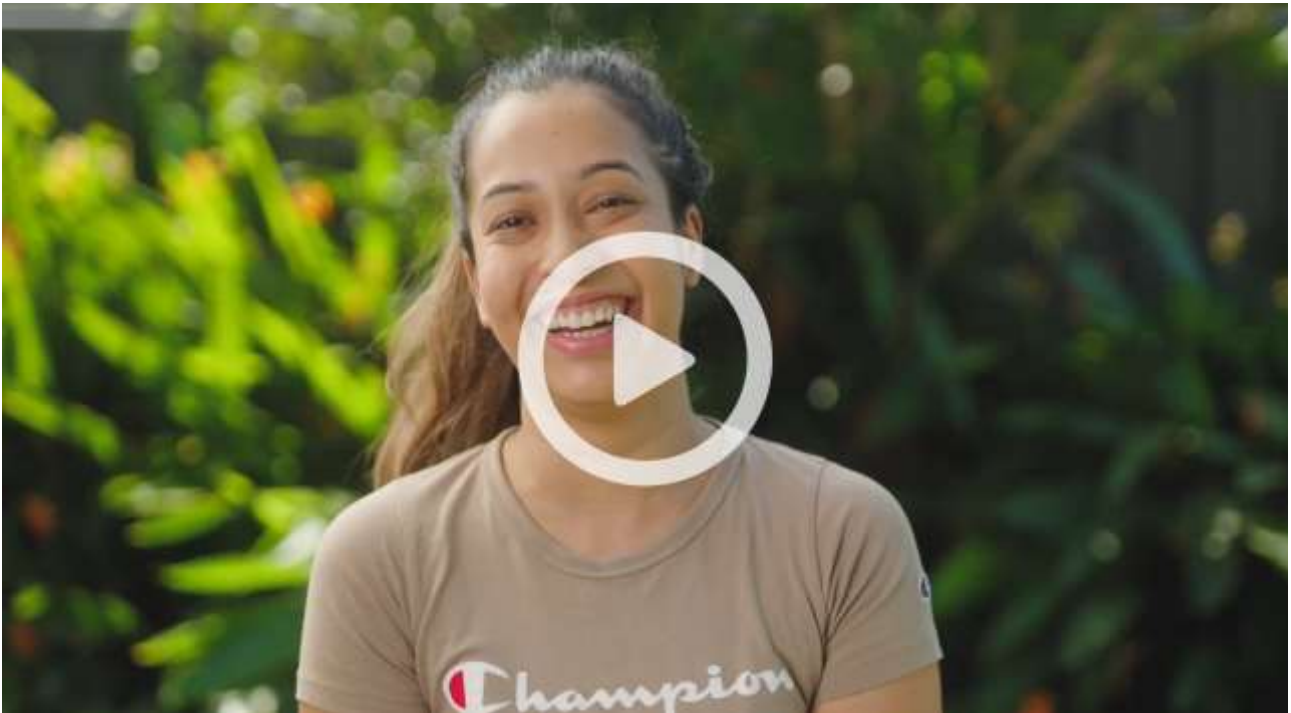
