A bit about us

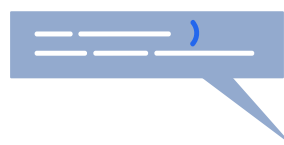

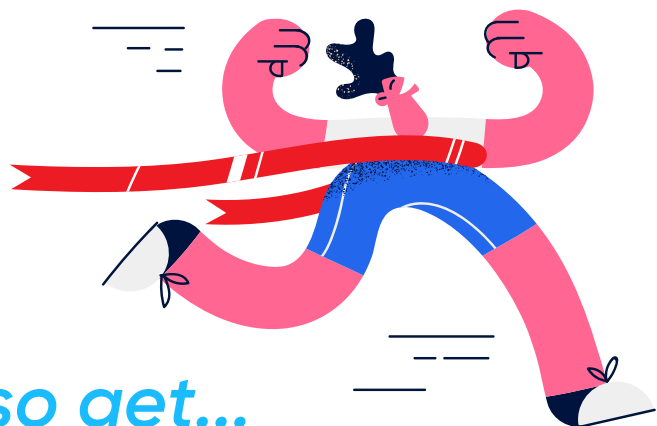
