



Information on Clinical Teaching and Sessions

As a clinical tutor in the Medical Program, you are uniquely placed to influence the learning and development of our students in their clinical training.

This includes:

- clinical skills such as performing a history and physical examination,
- procedural skills from taking a blood pressure to urinary catheter insertion, and
- a student's clinical communication skills development.

The Clinical Practice team aims to encourage students to become competent clinicians through a collaborative approach sharing our variable skillsets and knowledge to enhance the learning experience for our students.

The group sizes are small, and our tutors are also well placed to provide mentorship and professionalism training within the clinical tutorial group setting. In this position you are offered the opportunity to develop your skills through Faculty development sessions and other training options.

In the application process you will be prompted to indicate your preferences as outlined below.

Clinical Practice sessions will be located either on Bond University main campus or Bond University Clinical Education & Research Centre located at Robina Hospital (BUCERC).
