Overview of Junaya Aboriginal Corporation (Junaya)

Junaya is located in Blacktown, Western Sydney and provides a range of services for vulnerable children, young people and families including 12-week case management support and group programs for parents and caregivers.

Junaya works with families who may be experiencing a range of needs associated with experiences of substance use, trauma, mental health issues, domestic and family violence or challenges with parenting.

Junaya aims to support families so children can be safe and healthy and remain living at home with their families and community.

About the role

The Aboriginal Family Worker provides child focused family casework through the agency's case management framework including home visiting. The Aboriginal Family Worker also delivers group programs for parents and caregivers.

About you

Junaya is looking for a person who is committed to working with children, young people and their families in a role that aims to build capacity for families so children experience increased

safety, development and wellbeing. If you have the following skills, knowledge and experience, please submit an application of no more than 3 -4 pages outlining how you meet the below criteria;

1. You will have a Diploma in Community Services or Case Management or other similar study in Social Science, Social Work or Counselling
2. You will have experience in case management with children, young people and families and understand the purpose and process of case management with vulnerable families
3. You will have an understanding of the impacts of colonisation for Aboriginal and Torres Strait islander children, young people, families and community.
4. You will understand issues that can affect children's safety and wellbeing within Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families
5. You will have a commitment to ongoing learning and working within Junaya's policy and case management framework
6. You will have good communication skills which include being able to engage with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families in challenging conversations including conversations about child protection concerns
7. You will be able to document all aspects of your work with families in a clear and concise way that follows the Junaya's policy and funding requirements
8. You will hold a current NSW driver's licence and a valid Working with Children clearance number.

It would be an advantage if you also had, but not necessary to apply

1. Experience in delivering parenting groups or other groups for people within the community
2. Knowledge of and relationships with other agencies in the Blacktown LGA
