The Role

An opportunity for Board Directors to join, and in addition an opportunity within the short term for a role as Board Chair. Currently all Board positions are voluntary, however the Board is in the process of implementing a policy for remuneration of Directors.

Board Directors are required to prepare for and participate in seven board meetings per year, three (3) of these being full day meetings and four (4) on a Thursday for two (2) hours.

Please note Directors are appointed for a three (3) year term, with maximum number of four (4) consecutive terms.

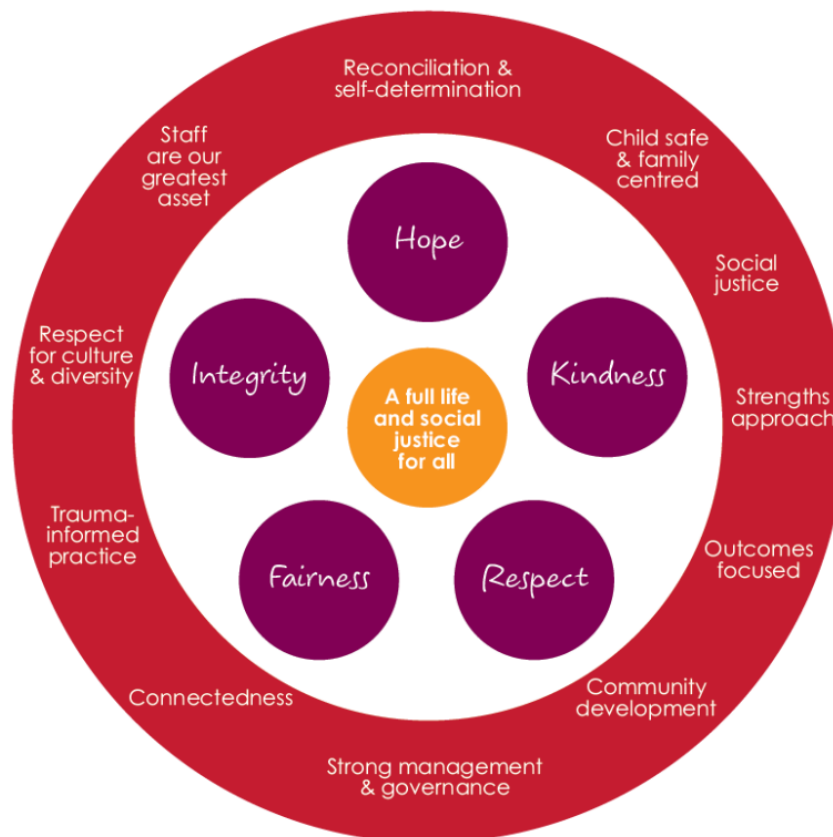
