With a strong focus on grants, trusts, foundations and philanthropic partnerships, you will help lead the work to identify and develop strategic funding opportunities, build and steward strong relationships, and translate EJA's complex legal, advocacy and campaign work into compelling cases for support and communications about our impact.

You will also take a senior role in EJA's established Philanthropy program, working alongside fundraising colleagues, Co-CEOs and senior leaders to shape relationship strategies, deepen donor engagement and support the acquisition and stewardship of significant donor relationships.

- Research, write and deliver compelling grant applications, funding proposals, cases for support, reports and acquittals tailored to different audiences.
- Build and steward strong, long-term relationships with philanthropic partners, identifying opportunities for renewed, increased and multi-year support.
- Maintain close oversight of philanthropic pipelines, funding agreements, reporting requirements and key commitments, supported by accurate and effective CRM management.
- Represent EJA in meetings, briefings and engagement with current and prospective philanthropic partners.
- Take a senior role in EJA's Fundraising program, working alongside philanthropy colleagues, CEOs and senior leaders to shape cultivation and stewardship strategies for significant donor relationships.
- Use fundraising data, donor insights and sector knowledge to inform priorities, pipeline development and relationship strategies.
- Take an active role in income forecasting, budgeting, work planning, fundraising reporting and broader organisational planning.
- Build strong, trusted relationships with lawyers, campaigners, Public Engagement colleagues and other teams across EJA.
- Contribute to the EJA team and the running of the organisation and office, including volunteer supervision, and participate in all relevant aspects of EJA planning, review and reporting.

Selection criteria

You will bring significant fundraising and philanthropy experience to work confidently across grants, partnerships and major donor relationships.

Essential

- Significant experience in fundraising, philanthropy, grants and major gifts
- Demonstrated ability to identify, develop and secure philanthropic funding opportunities and contribute to sustainable income growth.
- Exceptional written communication skills, with experience developing persuasive funding proposals, reports, acquittals, cases for support or other high-quality communications.
- Ability to understand complex information and translate it into clear, accurate and compelling narratives for different audiences.
- Strong verbal and interpersonal communication skills and confidence working with donors, funders, senior leaders and internal and external stakeholders.
- Demonstrated ability and strong understanding to build trusted, respectful relationships with donors, funders and other stakeholders.
- Experience working collaboratively across teams and with subject-matter experts to develop compelling funding propositions and communicate impact.
- Demonstrated ability of independence, initiative and accountability while maintaining strong collaboration and communication.
- Experience using CRM systems, data, research and insights to manage relationships and inform fundraising decisions.
- Strong attention to data integrity, record-keeping and confidentiality.
- A commitment to environmental and social justice.
- A demonstrated commitment to working in ways that align with EJA's values of ambition, collaboration, respect, positivity and justice.

Desirable

- Prior experience managing a philanthropic program and cultivating significant donor relationships.
- Knowledge of the Australian philanthropic landscape.
- Experience developing funding propositions or communications involving complex advocacy, legal, policy or campaign work.
- Previously worked within an environmental, climate, First Nations justice, human rights, legal or social justice organisation.
- Experience using Salesforce and fundraising data to support prospect identification, moves management and income growth.

Location

Ideally Melbourne, with the opportunity to work regularly (but not exclusively) from home. Other locations in Australia may be considered for an exceptional candidate.

Terms and conditions

Terms and conditions for these roles will be negotiated based on the following:

- The position is full-time and permanent. A 0.8 work week will be considered.
- EJA encourages flexible work arrangements and there is some scope for negotiation with respect to days and hours of work.
- The role is based in Melbourne at our office in Carlton, with travel outside Melbourne required occasionally.
- This role is based in a shared open-plan office where each team member has a dedicated desk.
- Out of hours work is required occasionally.
- Terms and conditions of employment are based on the Victorian CLCs Multi-Enterprise Agreement with over-agreement salary and conditions depending on experience. Salary range for full-time work is \$111,871- \$117,995 depending on experience, plus superannuation and leave loading
