1. Position purpose

Orange Door

The Orange Door bring together different workforces and expertise from partner organisations [including other Community Service Organisations (CSOs) with specialisation in Child Wellbeing, Family Violence, and Persons Using Violence], Aboriginal Services, Family Safety Victoria (FSV) and Department of Families, Fairness & Housing (DFFH)], to create an integrated Orange Door team. The Orange Door is a consolidated intake point for:

- adults, children, young people and families experiencing family violence.
- persons using family violence.
- families in need of support with the care, development and well-being of infants, children and young people.

Uniting holds the Child Wellbeing specialty portfolio.

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The main location of the Orange Door Bayside Peninsula is Frankston, but in order to be accessible to clients, access points at other locations, include Hastings and Bentleigh. Employees may be based at one of the access points.

Practitioner position

Orange Door Practitioners work as part of a multi-agency team to deliver high quality, safe and effective responses to adults, children, young people and families experiencing family violence, persons using violence and families in need of support with the care, development and well-being of infants, children and young people.

The practitioner works with clients to provide information, advice, and an initial assessment with a focus on risk assessment and safety planning. Assessments where there are children/young people involved, use the "best interests" framework. Practitioners may support clients further through providing immediate support, advocacy and referral to other services.

A matrix management model will apply, with Orange Door Practitioners reporting to a Team Leader on a day-to-day basis. This Team Leader may be any employee of any of the organisations comprising the Orange Door. Formal line management and supervision will be provided to all Uniting employees by the Uniting Orange Door Team Leader. Practitioners will also receive support and guidance from Orange Door Practice Leaders.

4. Key responsibility areas

Service delivery

- Work within a specialist Child Wellbeing discipline to deliver Orange Door services (within role and scope of the Orange Door) and develop an understanding and capabilities to work safely across other areas of specialisation (with appropriate training and supervision).

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- Deliver screening and triage, assessment, crisis responses, service planning, targeted interventions, allocation and coordinated referrals consistent with the Integrated Practice Framework, Operational Guidelines, Service Specifications and relevant risk assessment tools and frameworks.
- Deliver services and support via phone, within the Orange Door site and outreach at client's home or other sites.
- Use professional judgement and utilize integrated consultation to identify, assess and prioritise risks and needs of adults, children, young people, families and persons using violence.
- Work collaboratively with the Orange Door team to support integrated risk assessment and planning, including participating in case conferences, meetings and the resolution of stakeholder issues.
- Recognise and identify limits of own expertise and when to seek advice or refer client to specialist Orange Door practitioners or Practice Leaders to ensure safe practice.
- Identify when a Central Information Point (CIP) request is required and refer request to the Family Violence Practice Leader.
- Submit requests with Orange Door Team Leader for allocation into core services for clients.
- Apply for brokerage on behalf of clients in accordance with Brokerage Guidelines.
- Navigate the broader service system for clients by referring clients to services and providing clients with information and support.
- Record client information accurately on the Orange Door Client Relationship Management (CRM) system.
- Handle client information in accordance with the Family Violence Information Sharing Scheme (FVISS), Child Information Sharing Scheme (CISS), information security and privacy policies and requirements.
- Participate in training and development activities designed to build capabilities to work effectively in the Orange Door environment.
- Share integrated service approaches and learnings with members of the Orange Door team and other key stakeholders.
- Contribute to the review, development and implementation of systems, policies and procedures to build and enhance the Orange Door service model.
- Participate in formal supervision and performance development and management in accordance with Uniting requirements.

Personal accountability

- Compliance with Uniting's values, code of conduct, policies and procedures and relevant government legislation and standards where relevant.
- Cooperate with strategies to actively ensure the safety, protection and well-being of children who come into association with us.
- Ensure appropriate use of resources.
- Work collaboratively with Uniting (Victoria Tasmania) employees and external stakeholders in accordance with Uniting's values and professional standards of behaviour.
- Actively participate in initiatives to maintain, build upon and promote a positive and collaborative workplace.
- Identify opportunities to integrate and work collaboratively across teams.
- Take reasonable care for your own health and safety, and health and safety of others (to the extent required).
- Promote a positive safety culture by contributing to health and safety consultation and communication.
- Promptly respond to and report health and safety hazards, incidents and near misses to line management
- Attend mandatory training sessions (i.e. equal employment opportunity, health, and safety) and mandatory training specific to position.

Qualifications

- Must be assessed to meet the mandatory minimum qualification requirement for specialist family violence roles in [Victoria Mandatory minimum qualifications for specialist family violence response roles | vic.gov.au](https://www.vic.gov.au/victoria-mandatory-minimum-qualifications-for-specialist-family-violence-response-roles)
 - Degree in Social Work or other qualification in family violence or related discipline that meets Australian Qualification Framework [AQF] Level 7 [bachelor, graduate certificate or masters degree];
 - or hold a diploma in a discipline related to family violence and be in the process of working towards a qualification that meets the MMQ;
 - or have at least 2 years relevant professional experience and be in the process working towards a qualification that meets the MMQ;
 - or have been working in a specialist family violence role prior to July 2021.

Experience

- Demonstrated ability as a practitioner in the child, youth and family welfare field.
- A commitment to the family-centered approach and the family strengthening and empowerment models of practice.
- An understanding of the 'Best Interests' framework, CYFA 2005, Family Violence Protection Act 2008, FVISS, CISS and MARAM Frameworks is desirable.
- An understanding of the gendered nature of family violence

Core selection criteria

- **Values alignment:** ability to demonstrate and authentically promote Uniting's values that respect the uniqueness and value of every individual; establish and maintain right relationships that enable people to be influential in their own support arrangement and ensure they are treated with dignity and respect; build on the strengths and abilities of all; demonstrate transparency and accountability.
- **Child Safety:** Demonstrated ability to provide safe environments for children and young people and protect them from abuse and neglect.
- **Consumer centeredness:** foster, promote and implement a culture that keeps consumers at the centre of everything we do; demonstrates an awareness of and prioritises the needs of consumers; focuses on optimal outcomes for consumers.
- **Consumer engagement and case management:** ability to engage individuals and families and to provide outreach services, sometimes in a difficult or stressful context; Demonstrated ability to work flexibly to meet the current needs of women, children, young people and families.
- **Cultural awareness:** demonstrated knowledge of practices to engage and assure the cultural safety of clients from a diverse range of backgrounds, including those from an Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander or CALD background, or the LGBTI community.
- **Stakeholder relationships:** ability to engage, build and maintain strong, mutually beneficial professional relationships with internal and external stakeholders; track record of being able to sustain positive, collaborative and effective relationships; promotes harmony and consensus through diplomatic handling of disagreements; builds trust through consistent actions, values and communication.
- **Teamwork:** cooperates and works well with others in pursuit of team goals; collaborates and shares information; shows consideration, concern and respect for others feelings and ideas; accommodates and works well with the different working styles of others; encourages resolution of conflict within the group; willingness to be proactive and help others; contributes to the continuous improvement of a positive, collaborative and effective work environment

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- **Communication:** excellent interpersonal skills; strong written and verbal communication skills, including the ability to prepare for and conduct case plan meetings and implement agreed actions
- **Problem-solving:** proven ability to take a solution-focused and strengths-based approach within a complex, ambiguous and evolving community services environment
- **Administrative skills:** excellent organisational skills; high level of attention to detail and accuracy; experience in handling sensitive information and maintaining privacy; knowledge of Client Management Systems / Databases or the ability to quickly develop competency in use of such systems; high level computer literacy skills including demonstrated experience in Microsoft Office; well-developed literacy and numeracy skills and experience in preparing written reports including case notes and database reporting.

- A satisfactory national police records check is a condition of this position and is repeated every three years and International police check if required.
